We are a think tank-type organization with 75 members.

<u>Coordinator in Projects Sponsored by the Visegrad Fund – "Visegrad Projects"</u>

In 2019 we decided to start a common platform as a V4 civil society initiative – **the Visegrad Women's Initiative** to help promote women's employment with particular emphasis on the reconciliation of work and private-family life by sharing knowledge, experiences and best practices with special regard to the values of our region and its sustainability. This happened in "peacetime", but during the implementation of our first Visegrad project **"Women, Families, Careers - a Civil Society Forum in the V4 Spirit"** (from February to October 2020) the Covid pandemic suddenly intervened, and all participants and stakeholders experienced its consequences, including the transition to online methods of communication, both in our private as well as work-lives, almost overnight.

We soon learned what challenges the pandemic posed to women and families, and that is when we designed our second V4 research program: **"Women, Families, Careers – Effects of the Pandemic on Work-Life Balance in the Visegrad Countries"** (between October 2021 and April 2022) in partnership with the Business & Professional Women CR z.s. from the Czech Republic, the Association of Business Women from the Slovak Republic and the Pedagogical University of Krakow of Poland. Although the global emergency caused by the Covid pandemic has passed, circumstances have nevertheless changed. One of these is the huge change and acceleration in the field of digitalization.

In response to this change, our organization would like to help groups particularly important to us by drawing attention to the challenges and opportunities they are facing in today's "digital world" as it affects them in child rearing and the workplace as well as how they spend their leasure time. We have therefore initiated and implemented our "Women, Families, Careers – Digital Solutions in Adult Learning" project in order to help women and families increase their knowledge and self-confidence in relation to digitalization and to help them make significant contributions to the digital transition of their countries.
